Community Grants Available for Macclesfield

Macclesfield Town Council has been offering its Community Grants Scheme for the past 2 years and continues to welcome applications.

Last financial year, the community Grant Scheme awarded a total of around £25,000 to a wide variety of projects and groups, such as Macclesfield Boys Boxing Club, North West Air Ambulance and Age UK's Men In Sheds.

The grant scheme welcomes applications from all sections of the community of Macclesfield and has two levels of support. There is a short application form for grants up to £250 and a slightly more detailed form for grants up to £2,000.



The scheme seeks to support activities that are for the broad benefit of the residents and community of Macclesfield and applications are asked to express their project's benefits and also costs and match funding.

Welcome to the new Mayor of Macclesfield

On the 15th May we thanked our outgoing Mayor, Cllr Alift Harewood MBE for her year in office representing Macclesfield and welcomed Cllr Beverley Dooley to the position of The Mayor of Macclesfield.

Cllr Dooley will continue the historic and civic traditions of the role, dating back to Thomas de Astbury in 1330.

Cllr Adam Schofield was elected to the post of Deputy Mayor and a cadet from St John Ambulance will be selected as the Mayor's Cadet.



The Mayor has nominated two charities to support this year, Reach Out And recover (ROAR) , who support people with a history of substance misuse, and Space 4 Autism, a group providing purpose made facilities for children and families living with autism. Cllr Dooley will be hosting a number of charity events in the forthcoming year to raise money for these two local causes.

The ceremony was supported and attended by members of the community including the Mayors of Bollington, Congleton and Cheshire East as well as family and friends of Cllr Dooley.

Cllr Dooley paid tribute to the retiring Mayor, Cllr Harewood, and thanked her for a fun-filled and inclusive 2016-17 civic year.

Macclesfield Council is looking to find ways to make activity the easy option in the town and launched MaccTivity, covering a number of schemes the council is championing
