Hosted by Macclesfield Town Council and Macclesfield RSPB Wildlife Explorers, there were lots of nature related activities to enjoy including a nature trail, a chance to hold some creepy crawlies, flint fire lighting, marshmallow toasting and of course the famous giant storytelling tepee!

Local actor Emily Anslow entertained families with tales about nature and conservation in Macclesfield, and storytime with the Mayor, Cllr Janet Jackson MBE saw lots of children enjoying the popular children's book 'Six Dinner Sid' by author Inga Moore.

Macclesfield RSPB Wildlife Explorers kept everyone busy making lavender bags, seed bombs, bird feeders, nest boxes and treats for garden creatures. The free event, which is organised by Macclesfield Town Council, is designed to encourage outdoor play throughout the cooler seasons. Helena Gowler, Community Engagement Office for Macclesfield Town Council, commented that 'Welly Walk and Nature Needs You has become a regular event in the annual calendar and we always know autumn has arrived when the event comes around.

Great Feedback on new Town Ranger service

Macclesfield has its first Town Ranger to tackle town maintenance and grot spots. The new service addresses issues raised through recent consultations, where residents have commented that they would like to see a concerted effort to tackle litter, dog fouling, graffiti and the general appearance of the town.

Adrian Bullock, who has been Ranger since April, has already made a big difference to the town. He visits each ward on a regular basis to clear messy areas, repair and maintain benches and street furniture and also report and chase larger issues for repair, such as highways and public property maintenance. He has also been involved with the summer planting around the town.

This new service has been well received by many, with a number of kind comments being shared with us.

Council Supports Macclesfield Town FC Youth Project



Macclesfield Town Council is working with Macclesfield Town Football Club on a new football programme called Premier League Kicks. The programme uses the reach and appeal of the Premier League and network of professional football clubs to regularly engage children and young people of all backgrounds and abilities in football, sport and personal development, providing a trusted, positive influence in high-need areas across England and Wales.

The aim is to get as many youngsters aged between 8 and 16 years off the streets by taking part in the programme. The FREE sessions, held at Macclesfield Academy, are led by the Community Sports Trust team. One great opportunity that some of the participants will be able to do is represent Macclesfield Town at the Premier League Kicks cup. This gives some of the youngsters a chance to compete in a tournament and meet others from other clubs, and it brings all the clubs and participants together.

Jack Parry, from the Community Sports Trust team said "This programme is popular all over England delivered by other football clubs, and we are privileged to have this programme at our club." PL Kicks started in 2006 and has a long history of using the power of football and the value of sports participation to help youngsters in some of the most high-need areas. The scheme has also enabled thousands of youngsters to find routes into education, training and employment with volunteering being a key component.

Gillian Ainley, of Macclesfield Town Council added "It is a great opportunity to be part of this project, and we hope that those taking part will really benefit from these free sessions."



Pram Fit



Pram Fit is an exciting project which has been launched by Macclesfield Town Council. It is aimed at new parents who are looking to get back into fitness without the added pressure of needing to find a babysitter as pre-school children are welcome too! Pram Fit sessions will be based around slowly re-introducing exercise and incorporating prams and strollers.

Over the winter months Pram Fit will be held in St Pauls Church from 9.30am on Thursdays. Sessions will last for half an hour.

Women taking part will need to be at least 6 months post-natal.



Park Fit

In June, Macclesfield Town Council launched Park Fit, a free, weekly half hour fitness session in South Park led by a qualified personal trainer. Park Fit was introduced to provide an easy, free way for people to access guided physical activity tuition which they can then use outside of the sessions to kick start a healthier lifestyle.
