Saturday 28th April saw the launch of Macclesfield's very own parkrun, taking place in South Park.



parkrun's are weekly, 5km volunteer-led, timed runs which take place at 9am every Saturday in parks across the world. There are over 2 million people registered to take part in parkrun globally. To register to take part in parkrun either as a runner or as a volunteer, visit www.parkrun.org.uk where you will receive your runners barcode.

In November 2017, Macclesfield Town Council called potential volunteers to a meeting to discuss how the idea of parkrun could become a reality. Following this meeting, a dedicated core event team was created and the finer event details were completed.

At Macclesfield Town Council, we really believe in making activity the fun and easy option and parkrun fits perfectly with this ethos.

The work that has taken place over the last year will mean that Macclesfield will have a parkrun for many, many years to come. The core event team are led by Event Director's Tim Marsh and Jim Nettle. Without such a stong team of volunteers, the event wouldn't be able to take place.

Huge thanks go to Macclesfield Academy for kindly allowing their carparking spaces to be used by Macclesfield parkrunners.

The Park Tavern on Park Lane has opened its doors on Saturday mornngs for bacon sandwiches, cake and drinks to any runners wanting to have a catch up after the event.. It is now known as 'The parkrun Tavern' on Saturday mornings!

Building homes for birds on the Weston estate

Pupils at St John the Evangelist C of E Primary School on Ivy Road have been working on a project with Macclesfield Town Council to bring a splash of colour to this year's bird nesting season on the Weston estate.

The Kendal Road bird sanctuary which was transformed into a small woodland conservation area back in 2014, provides a pleasant spot for local people to enjoy. Macclesfield Town Council have provided the 15 wooden bird boxes which have been wonderfully painted by pupils at St John's School.





The bird boxes have been kindly installed by volunteer David Jackson, ready for bird nesting season. It is hoped that children and families will enjoy spotting the brightly coloured boxes and that birds will enjoy having a lot of beautifully decorated homes to choose from!

Caroline Waites, Headteacher of St John the Evangelist Primary School commented that 'We were very excited to be invited to contribute to the

local Bird Sanctuary Bird Box Project. Children from all year groups had a fantastic time creating their designs and are hoping that the local community will enjoy the splash of colour these boxes bring.'

The Mayor of Macclesfield's Civic Awards are a highlight in the Mayoral calendar, and recognise the contribution made by people to the community that benefit others or the town as a whole. Street Sports

The sessions are open to a wide range of sports and activities and the coaches come with a range of sporting equipment including cricket, hockey and tennis as well as the inevitable football and basketball. The young people decide on the night the activities they want to do and the coaches help and support the activity.

There are three sessions every week: - Tuesday Jasmine Park MUGA 5.30 to 7.30pm; Wednesday Banbury Close fields Hurdsfield 5.30 to 7.30pm and Thursday ion South Park from 6 to 8pm.

Children remain the responsibility of their carers, parents or guardians and are not the responsibility of the sports coaches.

Applications Open for Community Grants

Since its inception in 2015, Macclesfield Town Council has provided a Community Grant Scheme to support projects, events and activities in Macclesfield that demonstrate a benefit to residents and communities in the town.



Macclesfield Council has, to date, granted around \pounds 70,000 through its Community Grant Scheme to activities as diverse as the Potato Riot to the provision of community training.
