### Your Mayor

Councillor Janet Jackson MBE was elected as Mayor of Macclesfield on 13th May. The Deputy Mayor is Councillor Sarah Bennett-Wake.

Janet was originally elected to Macclesfield Borough Council in 1991 where she represented Central Ward until the Council was superseded by Cheshire East Council. She was first elected to Cheshire East in 2011 and became Charter Trustee Mayor for 2014/15 civic year. Janet has sat on the Town Council since it's creation in 2015.

The Mayor's Charities are both Macclesfield based and ones which she has supported over many years. Just Drop-In, located on Duke Street, opened in 2001, provides help for young people from the ages of 12 to 25. Speaking Up Speaking Out (SUSO), located on Old Park Lane supports adults with learning disabilities helping them to socialise and take part in many and varied activities.





The Mayor's theme for the year will be community cohesion. To promote inclusiveness across the age ranges from young to old, and to promote and support the many measures that can be taken to prevent isolation in our community.

### **Sparrow Park**

For some time the Sparrow Park project has been underway to improve the park and make it more of a feature of the town.



The park was originally built to appreciate the panoramic views across the surrounding hills but its value as a viewpoint had been much reduced by the growth of several trees on the hillside which were blocking the view. These have now been removed to return the park close to its original state and to open up the view so it can be better appreciated.

Macclesfield Town Council commissioned an interpretation board and this has now been installed and looks amazing. It provides visitors to the park with information about the view and the town's historic past as well as celebrating Macclesfield and its position as a gateway to the Peak District.

The improvements to the park environment have included additional flower planting, more focussed cleaning and litter picking as well as the placing of bat and nest boxes in the trees to improve opportunities for nature. The addition of the lighting in the trees has helped to make the park a welcoming place to relax in the evenings and has encouraged people to spend time there.

The park was formally known as Bunkers Hill, but known by locals as Sparrow Park because of its diminutive size.

It commemorates the generosity of Francis
Dicken Brocklehurst JP
whose gifts to the town included Victoria Park









### **Bikeathon success**

Almost 200 intrepid cyclists got back in the saddle for the 2019 Macclesfield Bikeathon.

The event took place on Sunday, May 11th, beginning and finishing at Macclesfield Leisure Centre.

There was a 6-mile family ride, a 30-mile route and a more demanding 60-mile ride around the Cheshire Plain. Some even took part with their pets - carrying them in a basket on their bike.



The Bikeathon was a regular on the Macclesfield calendar for many years, attracting up to 1,500 people and it is hoped this is the beginning of similar success.

Darren Allgood, from Allgood Cycling, organised the event with help from Macclesfield Town Council. Proceeds from the event were donated to local charity Just Drop In. He said: "It was a great day and we have received some tremendous feedback about it. A lot of people wanted to know if we would be doing it again next year. Hopefully it will be bigger and better."



Ann Wright, from Just Drop, said: "As a Macclesfield charity we are passionate about our community and it's great to see the Bikeathon back with proceeds going towards helping local young people to find their feet."

## Town Ranger makes a difference



Macclesfield has its first Town Ranger to tackle town maintenance and grot spots. The new service addresses issues raised through recent consultations, where residents have commented that they would like to see a concerted effort to tackle litter, dog fouling, graffiti and the general appearance of the town.

Adrian Bullock, who has been Ranger since April, has already made a big difference to the town. He visits each ward in the town on a regular basis to clear messy areas, repair and maintain benches and street furniture and also report and chase larger issues for repair, such as highways and public property maintenance. He has also been involved with the summer planting around the town.

The Ranger Service is being piloted for a year by Macclesfield Town Council to see if this focussed effort can help with the town's appearance and hopefully make Macclesfield a nicer place to visit and spend time.

### Welly Walk returns



On Saturday 12th October 10am-2pm, there will be an outdoor play and nature themed event in West Park – Welly Walk and Nature Needs You.

The free event, which is organised by Macclesfield Town Council, is designed to encourage outdoor play throughout the cooler seasons. This is the third time the event has been held and will be delivered together with Macclesfield RSPB Wildlife Explorers. This year, the popular storytelling teepee den is back, complete with soft cushions and fairy lights to create a cosy atmosphere for children listening to tales.



There will also be a mini forest school, hands on flint fire lighting lessons along with marshmallow toasting, den building, a static bush craft display, birds of prey, storytelling, birdwatching, creepy crawlies and a Welly Wander around the park. The Welly Wander will involve locating footprints around the park and carrying out a small activity to help see the wonder in the great outdoors.

Families can drop in at any time during the event to collect their clue sheet. We hope to see you there!


