## Bikeathon 2020 Get on your bike for a good cause



Macclesfield is gearing up to welcome back the Macclesfield Bikeathon event which proved popular in the town for almost 20 years.

The Bikeathon which is funded by Macclesfield Town Council, returned to the town in 2019 and saw a fantastic 189 riders taking part. This year's event will take place on Saturday 16th May and will raise money for local charity Just Drop In.

The rides will all start and end in Market Place in the town centre. Here there will be lots of family activities and stalls to enjoy.

There will be 3 route options, a 12-mile family ride, a 33-mile route around the beautiful Cheshire Plain and for those looking for a more challenging ride, there is a 64 mile route on offer.

The event is being organised by Darren Allgood from Allgood Cycling who said 'organising the Bikeathon is such a rewarding experience. To welcome the year of the rat, Macclesfield Town Council in partnership with Macclesfield Community Artspace organised a dragon parade to set off from Market Place. This was followed by a free event at the United Reformed Church. The dragon was joined by the beautiful Ruby the Rat and Silky the Pig from last year's celebrations to mark the year of the pig.

Before the parade set off, people enjoyed the sounds of Tytherington School Mandarin class choir in Market Place.

The parade made its way to the United Reformed Church at Park Green where people were welcomed with a chance to taste some authentic food, Chinese inspired crafts including shadow puppet making, calligraphy and a chance to try on some authentic outfits as well as an opportunity to view the shadow puppet installations created by local schools and care homes.

## **Pancake Day Races**

The historic Shrove Tuesday event, supported by Macclesfield Town Council, saw competitors sprinting up and down Mill Street outside Macclesfield Town Hall while tossing pancakes. The competing teams ran a relay race up and down a short course between two points while flipping a pancake in a frying pan.



All money raised this year will go towards East Cheshire NHS Trust's minibus appeal, which is aiming to raise £45,000 for a wheelchair-accessible minibus needed to help patients, many of whom may be elderly and reliant on public transport, to return home once they no longer need a hospital bed.

Macclesfield in Bloom was awarded a Silver Gilt medal in the Britain in Bloom awards for the first time last year. Just one short of the Gold Medal, the Silver Gilt is an achievement beyond our 2018 Silver Medal.



## **Community Grants**

Macclesfield Town Council has been awarding grants to community groups since it was set up in 2015. Grants totalling around £40,000 have been given to a wide range of local charities and groups relating to areas such as social events and support for military service veterans, activities to combat social isolation, scout groups, craft groups and Macclesfield Pride.

Pete Turner, the Town Clerk of Macclesfield Town Council, commented that, "it has been one of the great pleasures of the council to help groups, individuals and events to support the community in Macclesfield. We have been able to help around 35 groups and activities in the town this year, projects supporting wildlife, allotments, activities for the young and older people, the

### New AEDs for the town



Macclesfield Town Council has provided and installed two additional Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for the safety of town residents.

The first unit is located on the corner of Brocklehurst Way and Manchester Road in Tytherington, housed inside a former telephone box. David Edwardes, ward councillor for Tytherington (pictured here with local resident Simon Palmer) identified the phone box as a suitable location and organised for Macclesfield Town Council to take responsibility for it, as well as coordinating the work involved to clean and prepare it ready for the AED installation.

The second is located at Park Green next to The Traditional Barbers in an area with a busy night time economy and a high footfall during the evenings.





AEDs do not require training and can be used by anyone to shock a person's heart back to normal rhythm if they suffer sudden cardiac arrest. When used alongside cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), they raise the chance of survival from 9% to 50% when compared to the use of CPR alone.

Each AED unit is housed in a temperaturecontrolled cabinet with access controlled by the 999 emergency services. In an emergency the caller will be directed to their nearest AED unit and given a code to release the ready-charged, ready to use defibrillator.

Pete Turner, Town Clerk for Macclesfield said 'This equipment will make such a difference in the event of a heart emergency, as it will be accessible to everyone. We welcome the support of the people of Macclesfield in the much needed placement of public access defibrillators for use by all in the community in the event of an emergency. Sudden cardiac arrest can strike anyone, at any time, and is the UK's biggest killer, killing more people than breast cancer, lung cancer and Aids combined. Every community should have lifesaving public-access AEDs available 24/7 ready in cases of emergency."
