Tell us about the project?

This Knit & Natter group was set up six years ago by our local PCSO, a local businessman who ran the skate centre and myself. The group was formed to tackle social isolation in elderly ladies. The group meet for two hours every Wednesday at Morton hall (£25 pw) and many of its members (approx 20) knit or crochet items for charity or hospitals. The group pay a pound a week for the session and purchase their wool and other materials out of their own pocket. I am aware some of the ladies are unable to attend as often as they want because they either can't afford the fee or to buy materials.

How will residents benefit from this?

This group is open to residents from all over Macclesfield and has benefitted those that attend by providing social interaction and friendships

How will residents help the project?


The group is self run with a chair, treasurer and secretary and has a bank account.

What difference do you hope this project will make?

Since the start of a return to some normality, the group has started to attract some new members from The Bridges Retirement home on Buxton Road. This will enable those residents to make new friendships as the majority have moved in the area from other parts of the town and borough.

How much will it cost?

I would like to subsidise the group for purchase of materials and hall rental fees £500

Tell us about the project?

A policy change at Cheshire East Council has resulted in Blakelow Road being removed from the winter gritting routes. This road is steep >10% and high altitude (200m). It is also home or the route to home for around 60 households. Some of these residents are vulnerable and require daily care visits and other health workers such as district nurses. This is a genuine safety issue for these residents and need us as their local council to pick up the issue as CEC will not review the policy decision until next April (2022)

How will residents benefit from this?

Residents will be able to walk to school, work or shops during sub zero periods if the road is gritted at 0°C. This gritting will also allow access for care workers, health workers and carers to use the road on a daily basis.

How will residents help the project?

Although there are grit bins on the road, it is unrealistic to expect resident to grit through the whole winter period.

What difference do you hope this project will make?

This will make a huge difference to the residents concerned and reduce the anxiety they now have as a result of this CEC decision.

How much will it cost?

I have contacted three separate third party companies who are quoting around £1500 for the winter period (depending on the severity)
