What we want to do!

Reach Out and Recover would like to have a street performance of real life portraits, Individuals who have created art work through different mediums to give the general public an insight to their personal journey to discover themselves without addiction.

Each person will stand throughout Macclesfield Town Centre with their artwork giving the general public the opportunity to ask them questions about their Journey.

Using the model of The Human Library, which is where human beings serve as an open book and the readers (general public) have conversations that they would not normally have access to.

Each person within the street performance represents part of a group in our society that is and has been subject to prejudice, stigmatization or discrimination because of thier addiction past.

How did it go?

Metamorphosis went ahead on Mill Street in Macclesfield on 30th July 2022.

We had 19 Art displays and every artist stood by their art and spoke to the public.

The public that engaged with the art project commented on how fantastic it was and how moved they were by the stories that they heard and the artwork they saw.

Feedback Form

We asked the public to complete a feedback form and these were some of the responses.

What did the artwork that you saw today make you feel?

"Fantastic, enormous credit to you all for your positive outlook and developing strength, resilience and talent."

"I came and was immensely touched by their journeys and at how far they have come, they should be so so proud of themselves, I bought a lady a little quotation book just something she can look at when she is finding things a bit tough, I could see how much she wanted to get back on track for herself and her children, they all should be so proud."

"The artwork was amazing and so good to hear of such faith, hope & positivity. Well done."

Have you learnt anything from the Artwork, or speaking to the Artists today?

"The people I have spoken with today have touched my heart and I have never really understood addiction before. This today has humanized what you read about in the paper"

"I learnt that there are organizations that look past medication and work hard to help people back into the community"

Would you like to see more pop up events from ROAR and why?

"Yes definitely, I have thoroughly enjoyed what I have seen today"

"Yes I think it gave people a space to learn more about addiction and how hard everyone has worked."

"Yes, Its real life stories that make a difference within our community"

Did you already know about Reach Out and Recover before today's Art Exhibition?

"No, I didn't know about it, I always thought that people had to go into hospital to get help"

"Yes I have heard about them in my Church, they do an amazing job"

"Yes I saw it on facebook"

What if anything would you like to give feedback to the Artists from today's exhibition?

"Congrats! To see everyone at ROAR was amazing and to see the commitment and effort you are making."

"Life can be very hard - the fact you are here being a part of this amazing event is incredible"

Community Outreach

Social Media - 9, 296 people were reached by the advertising and video

At the event - 348 people spoke to the artists

Feedback forms - 60 people completed the feedback forms

Community Engagement - 2 new volunteer inquiries from the event.

Public Figures - Lady Mayoress and Brian Pudicome, Town Councillors.

Family members - 143 members of the Artist's families came to Macclesfield especially to support the event.

Financial Report

The total funding of £1990 was spent on the Art Project.

Alterations to funding allocations were made due to our partnership with Artspace we were able to use the facilities and materials that they could provide. That meant we did not have to buy in as many materials listed within the bid. Instead the funds were kept within Macclesfield and within a local charity.
