Queen's Platinum Jubilee

This year is a very special one for Her Majesty The Queen as she celebrates her Platinum Jubilee - marking a 70 year reign.

To help celebrate and mark the occasion in Macclesfield the Town Council a isupporting two very important projects.

The first of which is pictured on the front of this update. Mayor of Macclesfield Cllr David Edwardes has been very busy planting a tree in schools around the town. Ably assisted by the Town Rangers, and children from the schools, the trees planted by the Mayor will form part of the Queens Green Canopy (QGC), a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

With a focus on planting sustainably, the QGC encourages planting of trees to create a legacy in honour of The Queen's leadership of the Nation, which will benefit future generations.



The Town Council is also providing pots of funding to community groups to enable them to run Jubilee parties across Macclesfield over the weekend of the 4th and 5th June 2022.

Community groups will be able to apply for simple road closures with Cheshire East, can host the parties inside or out, include food and drink, and entertainment for children and adults alike.

COVID Remembrance Trees

As well as the Queens Green Canopy the Town Council has other tree planting project underway.

As a mark of respect the Councillors for each ward in Macclesfield chose a suitable location to plant a tree in honour of those who lost their lives during COVID.








The trees were specifically chosen by Lead Ranger Andy McKeith and are a mix of Prunus Serrula, a Tibetan Cherry with pink flowers in the Spring and cherries in the Autumn, Prunus Subbirtella Autumnalis, Winter Flowering Cherry and Sorbus Acuparia Joseph Rock, Mountain Ash.

Not only are they a lovely symbol of remembrance for those who lost their lives, but they are also great for wildlife and a good absorber of carbon monoxide, leaving a lasting legacy.

All trees are in publicly accessible locations, many next to benches should you choose to sit and remember.

ECO SUMMIT UPDATE

Staying with the GREEN theme, Macclesfield Town Council and Macctastic will be bringing you an update on last May's Eco Summit.

The summit was attended by over 70 people and a huge number of ideas were generated. The Town Council released an update in July letting interested parties and members of the public know all about the 16 action points that were identified as being achievable and visible, and which would have the most impact.

Now is the time for us all to come together to understand how those action points have progressed, which have been achieved and which ones have been a struggle. And where the focus will be for the coming year.

The next Eco Summit will be held as part of the Town Council's Nature Needs You event. The event which is normally held in West Park, will continue in that location and will be also be complimented by talks and presentations in St Michael's Church on Saturday 8th October 2022.



South Park Pavilion

You may have seen that recently Macclesfield Town Council has been looking for an architect to design a new pavilion building for the beautiful South Park. The Council is in the process of asset transfering the Pavilion from Cheshire East Council, and the plan is to deliver a brand new pavilion for the people of Macclesfield.



The park has had a pavilion overlooking its band stand for a number of years, with the current pavilion building replacing the original following a devastating fire in 1970s.

The current pavilion is deemed not fit for purpose and is partcondemned due to its lack of accessibility to the first floor. It is also in a very poor state of repair. The ground floor layout is not flexible for multiple user groups and the building's construction method means it is reaching the end of its lifespan and unfortunately cannot be modernised.





South Park Pavilion

The Town Council has listened to the residents and is looking to re-bui a structure that meets the needs, expectations and ambitions of the community and the park services, as well as encouraging visitors. The building needs to be truly flexible in regards to it's usage and sustainable whilst being uniquely 'Macclesfield'.

Because the pavilion needs to meet the needs of a diverse community will include the following

- Café/F&B/take away with outdoor eating facilities and alcohol license
- Accessible Changing Places toilet
- Community rooms for hire/free availability for schools, groups, exhibitions
- Space for Town Council Rangers, Gardeners, rest space for PCSOs
- Shared workspace area

- Location for Events wedding/ civil service venue
- Store for sports equipment to lo to visitors
- An information/booking point for the park
- Quiet/rest area for park users indoor & outdoor (not just café users)

This building will be truly accessible and include the following

- Fully accessible throughout
- Environmentally friendly build/power
- Balcony on 2nd floor/lift to the 2nd floor (if 2 storey design is chosen)
- A hatch to serve drinks/ice creams to park goers
- CCTV location/security features/ ventilation and future proof in light of COVID
- Public WIFI throughout

- External power point access for events
- Consider a few smaller rooms or clever partitioning for smaller meetings/functions
- Dementia/neurodevelopmental friendly design – colour scheme signage, acoustics, adjustable lighting
- Café facilities



Town Council's Successful Community Grant Programme

The Town Council's popular grants programme continues to go from strength to strength supporting a wide ranging representation from Macclesfield's worthy community groups.

At the start of last year the Town Council reviewed it's grants programme and re-launched with three tiers of grants. Micro Grants of up to £100 for small start up ideas or for one off projects that fit with the Macclesfield Town Council themes, Small Grants up to £250 and Large Grants up to £2000 and exceptional circumstance grants over £2000.

With that in mind, as we approach the end of the financial year, the Council has awarded over £30,000 to sports groups, wildlife organisations, groups working with young people, garden & wildfower planting projects, and community festivals - many of whom hadn't approached the Town Council before.

The Town Council Communities & Events Manager is working closely with Community & Voluntary Services Cheshire East, to promote the grants programme more widely, inform community groups of what the grants can be used for and how to apply, and also how the community groups can make themselves more financially sustainable in the future.

Character Assesment

Macclesfield Town Council is working on a Character Assessment which aims to preserve Macclesfield's distinctive character and, aided by good design, for the town to be an attractive place to live with a vibrant town centre, strong community spirit and flourishing civic pride.



Keen to preserve this uniqueness, Macclesfield Town Council commissioned Lambert Smith Hampton and Donald Insall Associates to prepare a Character Assessment documenting the character and local environment for each ward.

This document is intended to be used by property developers and architects to guide them towards the type of design that is sympathetic to the local area and contributes positively to the local environment, and any other person or organisation involved in the development process or who is interested in local character.

The overall aim of this Character Assessment is to:

- Promote the existing distinctive character of local areas including the built environment, green spaces and views.
- Encourage the design of new development to be of a good standard, retaining and enhancing the distinctiveness of the local area.
- Guide the design of all development within Macclesfield that reflects, harmonises with, and reinforces the best aspects of the local character of its buildings, green spaces and settings, such that it makes a positive contribution to the town.

Macclesfield Town Council thanks all residents, workers and school pupils who participated in the consultation.

Council to Improve Signage

The Council has approved a very exciting project to enhance the signage in and around the Town Centre. This project arose after lots of conversations with different groups of traders, businesses and importantly visitors to our town.



It was identified that signage from the train station pointing people in the direction of the town centre up Church Street was lacking, along with directions showing a more accessible route along Sunderland Street and Park Green.

Improved signage is also needed to draw people into the Indoor Market, including a directory of the traders available, and signage clearly marking The Castle Quarter as an up & coming area of the town centre.

Up to date maps and pointing out visitor attractions such as the different museums in town is also planned for the future.

The scheme will require planning permission from Cheshire East Council but the Town Centre and local shops and businesses are very



important to the Town Council and the upgraded signage is all a key part of making the town look attractive and a nice place to live and visit - so watch this space!



Record Numbers Saddle Up!

Last year the Macclesfield Bikeathon took place in October, following a period of uncertainty around in person events. It was a damp and cold day, so fingers crossed when the Bikeathon returns this year, the sun will be shining.

Last years event raised a fantastic £4500 for local charity Just Drop In and saw over 200 riders including family groups take part in the three different routes depending on experience.

Organiser Darren Allgood, from AllGood Cycling along with support from Just Drop In and the Town Council has great plans for 2022 and the event will be taking place on Saturday 14th May 2022.

Park Fit People!


In 2019 the Town Council vowed to help the people of Macclesfield get fit, and employed the services of local personal trainer Matthew Rigby.

Matt started by hosting early morning Park Fit sessions in South Park, then early evening sessions utilising the equipment already in the park as well as bringing some of his own. As the weather started to turn sessions were held in All Hallows sports hall which enabled them to carry on through the winter months. When the pandemic hit, ever resourceful Matt took his sessions to facebook.

The sessions are perfect for everyone, with options for those just starting on their fitness journey or ways to increase the burn for those already on their way. The majority are using your own body weight, so no need for any specialised equipment, but you might need a tin of beans, or a backpack stuffed with books.
