Meet your new Mayor

On 16th May 2022, at the Macclesfield Town Council Annual General Meeting, Cllr Fiona Wilson was unanimously elected by her fellow Councillors as Mayor of Macclesfield. Fiona is supported in her role as Mayor by her Consort, her husband Brian Puddicombe.

Each year the Mayor chooses two charities to support, and this year the Mayor has chosen Macc Youth Brass Band and The Northwest Air Ambulance Charity, both charities will benefit from many fundraising endeavours.

As well as being Mayor, Fiona is also the Town Councillor for South Ward, Chair of Personnel, Vice-Chair of Finance, and she sits on the Planning and Services Committees. Fiona is the Council's Town Centre and Regeneration Champion and a member of the Town Centre Recovery Working Group which has brought together various organisations who are working to deliver economic, environmental, cultural and community benefits for the people of Macclesfield.

Cllr Wilson is keen to focus on fostering a sense of community during her year in office. Cllr Wilson said "My theme for my year as Mayor is 'Our Community -Stronger Together'. We have so many hard-working volunteers, including all of our Town Councillors who make all the difference. I am also very proud of my own community in South Ward, where neighbours often stand together to support each other."

The Town Council's popular grants programme continues to support a wide range of Macclesfield's worthy community groups.

The Town Council has different tiers of grants:

- Micro Grants of up to £100 for small start up ideas or for one off projects that fit with the Macclesfield Town Council themes

- Small Grants up to £250
- Large Grants up to £2000
- And exceptional circumstance grants over £2000

All singing allotment!



8-14th August was National Allotment Week. Macclesfield Town Council own 7 allotment sites across the town, and manage a small number, with the majority being managed by their own association. Allotments are very in demand at the moment with long waiting lists, but we wanted to share the story of a successful application, who put a twist on her plot.

Someone who was on the waiting list was Clare Kewney. She'd had an interest in getting an allotment for a while, to look after alongside her busy life combining work, family and social time, as well as being an active member of local female only choir Chordiality. When Clare found out she was about to be allocated an allotment, we were already in the first lockdown.

As a community choir, Chordiality were devastated that they couldn't continue singing together. Not only do their members love singing, but when they founded Chordiality, they set out to ensure it was a welcoming, supportive and kind place for all members to attend. Many of the ladies were really beginning to feel the effects of lockdown isolation, so Clare invited other members to get involved and help her get the allotment off the ground.

And they jumped at the chance! Not only did it give many of them the perfect excuse for fresh air and a bit of physical exercise, they knew that they could look forward to seeing each other, to really make their "lottie" a sanctuary away from the worst deprivations of the pandemic.

So, from a fairly unkempt, overgrown plot that they took on in 2020, they now have a quite beautiful space, regular crops of delicious veggies, flowers, trees, and a fabulous space to meet and unburden themselves. There is a core group of ladies who are super-organised with planting schemes - and guiding the less experienced gardeners on tasks to tackle. They all chip in financially to buy anything needed, although they've been lucky to be given lots of things that they've upcycled and put to good use. They get expert advice from the other allotment holders too, who've been really friendly since day one.

Co-founder Caroline Hamer says "I guess you could say the pandemic gave us a bit of a challenge because we couldn't be together or sing together for so long, but once we could meet outside safely, the allotment was a saviour for many of us."



If you haven't yet heard of Chordiality it was set up in 2018. They had been part of another choir locally, but decided to set up on their own. It's run by six friends and they volunteer their time to run it, as it's not a business. They have over 60 members now (and Ben their conductor!), and they've opened for MaccPride, sung at Millie's Trust's annual fundraiser ball and are regulars at Treacle Market.
