Gold for Bloom

There were celebrations in Macclesfield at the end of October as the town was officially declared blooming marvellous. After only it's third year of entering the competition, Macclesfield struck gold in the region's leading environmental competition, the North West Britain in Bloom Awards, having previously been awarded Silver and Silver Gilt in the Small City category.

Bloom Committee Chair Cllr Janet Jackson MBE said: "We are absolutely thrilled to win gold in this prestigious competition. The success started with the hard work put in by the Macclesfield in Bloom committee, and we received fantastic support from volunteers, residents, businesses and organisations across the town centre and various wards of the town."

Committee member John Williams said the award was "for the town of Macclesfield, not just the In Bloom volunteers".

South Park Pavillion

An update on the Town Council's plans for a revamped pavillion in South Park

Macclesfield Town Council completed extensive consultation events held throughout August to determine the preferred scheme to replace the existing South Park Pavilion. Over 700 residents responded with their views on 5 different designs by local architects, Bower Mattin and Young. Two designs received strong endorsement and the council's architects were asked to create a design which is a fusion of resident's preferences.



The proposed scheme is for a two storey eco sensitive pavilion designed to provide a wide range of flexible spaces suitable for family gatherings, fitness, dance and regular cultural events. The ground floor consists of large café area with chill out spaces housing local art exhibits and magazines. It will lead to a canopied outdoor terrace with seating overlooking the bandstand. There are also two large multipurpose rooms which can provide a space for people to gather. The first floor overlooks the park and tennis courts. It will provide an event space for exhibitions, music, comedy nights and large family celebrations of up to 100 people.

The building will provide an information point for future events in the park and local area, together with a first aid post including a defibrillator.

There will be a Changing Places toilet with baby changing for all park users.

It is intended that the new building will reuse the existing pavilion slab and foundations. It will be super insulated and incorporate a turf/sedum roof to create a high thermal mass which will also assist water attenuation. Passive solar gain combined with a heat recovery and recirculation ventilation system, photo voltaic cells and air source heat pumps will be at the core of the renewable energy proposals.

Local stone and timber will be used in construction which will feature green walls as a part of the target to control the carbon footprint.

A detailed planning application has now been submitted to Cheshire East Council.

Once again the Town Council have planned a fantastically festive Christmas programme for the town to enjoy - we have everything from events, shopping, food and drink, plus a trail for the whole family to get involved in.



The town's Christmas celebrations kick off with a Christmas wreath making workshop on Tuesday 22nd November with proceeds going to the Mayor of Macclesfield's charities Macclesfield Youth Brass Band and North West Air Ambulance. This sell out evening saw tickets fly out of the door within 1 day of going on sale.

Does your community group need a financial boost?

The Town Council's popular grants programme continues to support a wide range of Macclesfield's worthy community groups.



The Town Council has different tiers of grants:

- Micro Grants of up to £100 for small start up ideas or for one off projects that fit with the Macclesfield Town Council themes
- Small Grants up to £250
- Large Grants up to £2000
- And exceptional circumstance grants over £2000

Examples of recent grant awards -

- Holy Trinity Church Hurdsfield were awarded £1,940 towards a community engagement project
- Barnaby Festival were successful in their request for £2000 to put towards research and stakeholder engagement as well as strengthening the board and their digital presence
- Macclesfield Cricket Club were awarded £2000 to create an area for women, children and disabled players
- Cygnets were awarded £2000 for equipment for their new rehearsal and performance space
- Just Drop In were awarded £1240 for a summer programme for children
- S:Park were awarded £250 for a centenary event

Park Fit People!

The Town Council originally partnered with Matt Rigby, a local personal trainer and run club organiser, back in June 2019, and commissioned him to run free Park Fit sessions in South Park. These well attended, 30 minute sessions made the most of equipment already in the park, supported by kit that Matt would bring with him.





When the pandemic struck Matt moved Park Fit into his kitchen and broadcast live over facebook twice a week, continuing to put us through our paces and keep us moving when other exercise options were limited.

Fast forward to today, and we are back to face to face sessions. Park Fit returned to South Park at the start of the Summer seeing large numbers take advantage of working out in the fresh air and beautiful surroundings.

With the on-set of the winter months, Park Fit has moved inside and can be found at All Hallows Sports Hall, 6-6:45pm on Thursdays. Sessions are FREE!
